




What is a Resource Facilitator?

Inclusive Education Services (IES) at UCF is creating a team of highly motivated individuals interested in mentoring students with intellectual disabilities!

Resource Facilitators (RFs) meet with students multiple times a week and provide academic, career, and social support. This job is different every day and as an RF you help create your work day and support a life changing experience for students with intellectual disabilities. Parts of the position include:

- 1:1 or small group tutoring
- Assisting students explore and connect with clubs on campus
- · Using your experience to help students with day to concerns; time management, study tips, roommate talks, etc.
- Facilitate campus events; Football games, concerts, plays, club meetings, working out or group exercise classes at the Recreation and Wellness Center (RWC), grabbing a meal at 63' South, etc. No campus activity is off limits...the sky is the limit with ideas?

Expectations/Responsibilities

Resource Facilitators are expected to provide a minimum of 10 hours of support every week

- Attend orientation training, staff meetings, and IES related events.
- . Support fellow RFs and be an active member of the IES team
- Assist students in navigating campus during the first two weeks of the semester
- Be available to work a minimum of 10 hours per week; including work evening and weekends.
- Provide academic and social support 2-3 times a week;
- Discussing academic progress, goals, social/campus engagement, professional development, health and wellness, roommate concerns etc.
- Support students connecting with campus by leading and attending various on campus events with students;
 Sporting events, Welcome Week and Homecoming activities
- Assist students with using Career Services, Recreation and Wellness, athletic events, etc.
- Assist students in using appropriate forms of communication with faculty, staff, and supervisors through email, Webcourses, GroupMe, and other communication platforms.
- Assist with on-campus UCF transportation (if necessary); shuttle, SEPS, bike rental, etc.
- Submit all administrative documentation/information by the requested deadline.
- · Maintain integrity and confidentially while working with students and professional staff.

Minimum Qualifications:

- · Students must be enrolled at the University of Central Florida
- Student must have minimum 2.5 GPA
- · No prior history of disciplinary actions with institutions
- Must be able to work evenings and weekends
- Must be able to attend Fall Training (August 19th-August 24, 2019), Spring Training (January 2nd January 4th, 2020)
