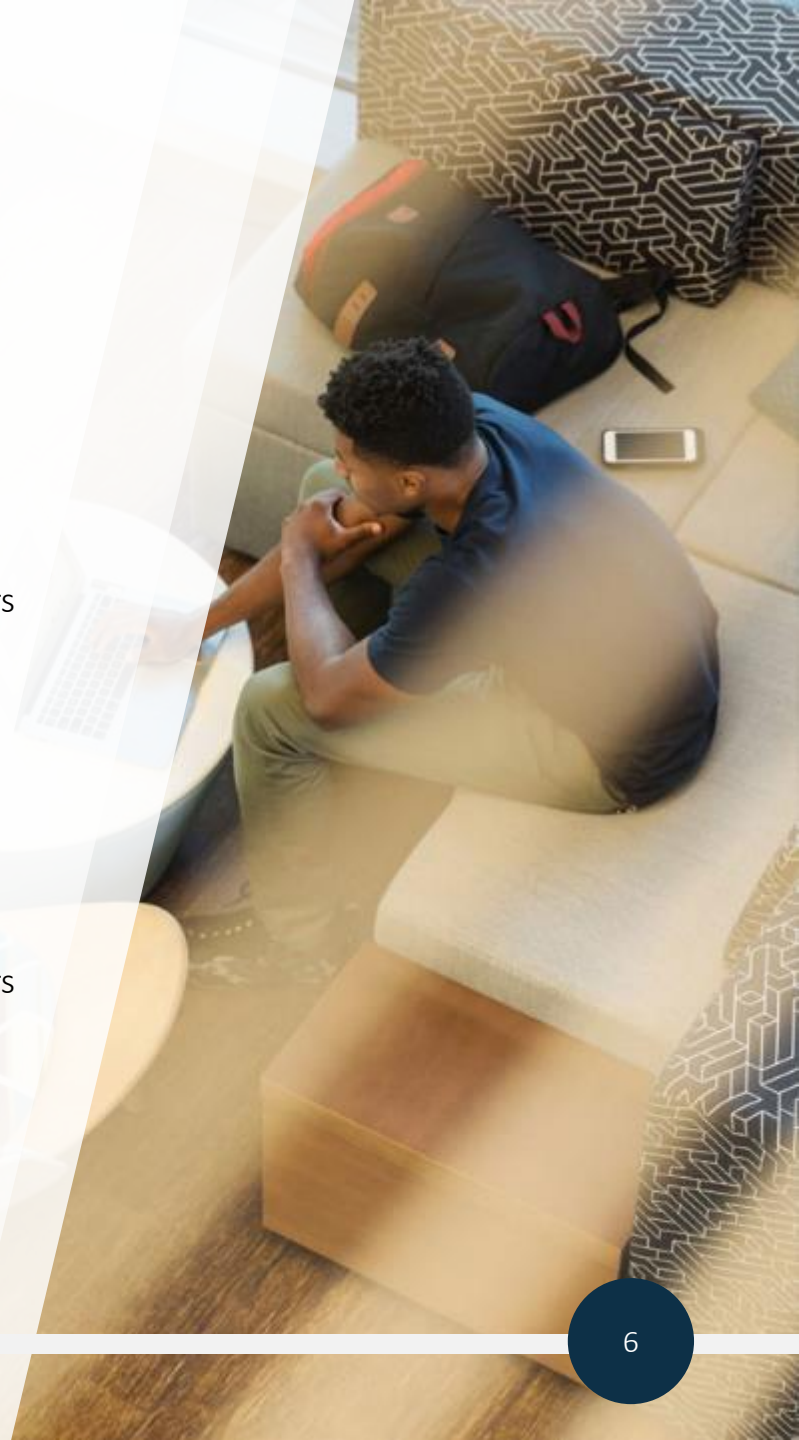

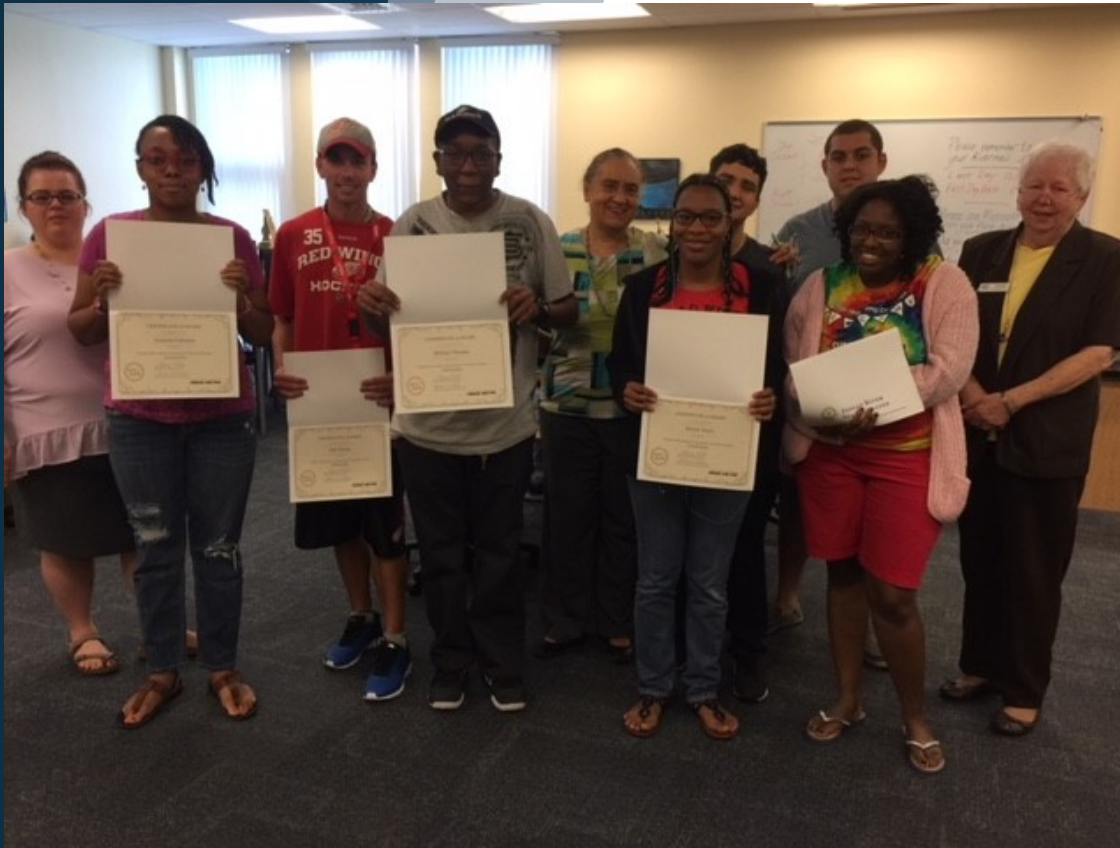
IRSC Activities

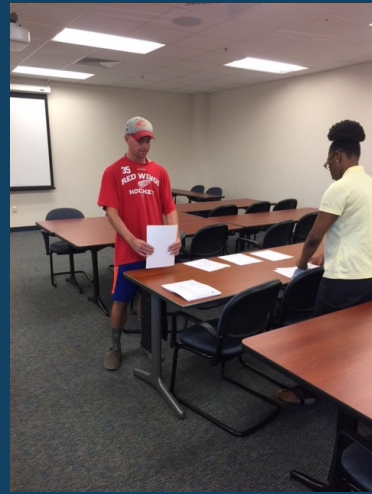
